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 LADWP'S LORP REPORT TO THE COURT - MARCH 2007

TO THE COURT, THE SPECIAL MASTER, ALL PARTIES AND THEIR ATTORNEYS:

In accordance with Paragraph 2(G) of the Court's Order of August 9, 2005 ("Court Order"), LADWP hereby submits this report setting forth the progress LADWP is making towards implementation of the LORP and reporting the amounts of groundwater pumping, water supplied for groundwater recharge, and water supplied for in-valley uses.

I. PROGRESS REPORT TOWARDS THE IMPLEMENTATION OF LORP

LADWP continues to make progress towards the implementation of LORP in a manner consistent with meeting the deadlines established by the Court Order. The significant events which occurred during the period of February 1 through February 28, 2007 demonstrating the progress made are as follows:

A. Efforts Continue To Be Focused On The Baseflow

During the month of February LADWP focused its efforts on establishing a permanent baseflow of approximately 40 cfs throughout the Lower Owens River. In this regard, LADWP incorporates by reference the data contained in its Court filings of February 27, 2007 and March 8, 2007.

Consistent with the Court's ruling of March 12, 2007, LADWP will coordinate a meet and confer with the parties and also arrange an inspection of the river, monitoring stations, and pumpback station by the parties.

LADWP hydrographers continue the process of calibrating flow meters and establishing reliable communications from remote measuring stations. All work continues on schedule to meet the July 27, 2007 deadline.

B. Ecosystem Sciences' Activities

ESI reports that during the month of February 2007 they organized and analyzed flow data to identify gaining and losing reaches of the river. ESI also continued to evaluate river conditions. ESI continued to work on the revisions to the LORP Monitoring and Adaptive Management and Reporting Plan. ESI reported

1 continued delays in issuing a revised plan due to the amount of revisions and now anticipates to have the
3 revised plan out by the end of March.

4 **II. GROUNDWATER PUMPING AND RECHARGE AMOUNTS FOR JANUARY 2007**

5 In accordance with Paragraph 2(G)(1-3) of the Court Order, LADWP hereby reports the required
6 information regarding groundwater pumping, water used for recharge, and in-valley water uses for the month
7 January 2007.

8 The total amount of groundwater pumping for the month of January 2007 was 7,002 acre feet of
9 water. This brings the cumulative pumping amount for the 2006-07 runoff year to 52,681 acre feet of water.
10 Exhibit A sets forth an itemization of the stated pumping amount by well field and well number.

11 During the month of January no water was provided for the recharging of groundwater levels in the
12 Laws Well Field. The total amount of water provided by LADWP for the recharging of groundwater levels
13 for the 2006-7 runoff year is 17,565 acre feet of water and is excess of the 16,294 acre feet required by
14 Section 2(B) of the Court Order.
15

16 As to water supplied by LADWP for in-valley uses, Exhibit B attached hereto sets forth the amounts
17 of water provided for irrigation and stockwater to lessees, recreation and wildlife, tribal uses, and
18 enhancement and mitigation projects, as required by Paragraph 2(G)(3) of the Court Order. As noted in
19 Exhibit B, the amount for tribal uses does not include tribal domestic uses. This is due to the fact that the
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1 figures for tribal domestic uses are self reported by the respective tribes and have not been reported by them.

3 This concludes LADWP's Report to the Court.


